It seems impossible, but graduation for the Class of 2019 is almost upon us. The graduation ceremony will be held at the Lancaster High School's Lou Bozigian Field on June 6th 2019 at 6:00 P.M. In order to make this a memorable occasion for all, we have put together the attached information packet for you and your student. Please review **ALL** of the enclosed information with your graduate. This is very important information and it includes some dated material that must be completed and returned by 3:00 PM on May 17, 2018. **PLEASE NOTE:** Receipt of this packet does not guarantee participation in the graduation ceremony. Your student's graduation status is based on his or her meeting all District and State graduation requirements.

Regretfully, in the past, some Seniors have not been allowed to participate in graduation due to missed deadlines and/or discipline issues. Please take a moment to review with your graduate the listed deadlines. Also, please discuss responsible behaviors during these last few weeks of school and during the graduation practices, Grad Night, and the Graduation Ceremony.

The attached **Graduation Agreement** is due back to the Activities Office, no later than 3:00 P.M. on Friday May 17, 2018. **Please print out the Signature Page, sign it and return it by this date.** Failure to return this agreement by the May 17th deadline will result in your graduate not being allowed to participate in the graduation ceremony.

Graduation and Grad Night are optional activities; therefore, participation may be denied with cause. (Reference: Education Code sections 48900 and 48915.)

Dear Parents, Guests and Graduates:

The Lancaster High School Staff and the Class of 2019 have worked very hard during the past four years in preparation for the Commencement Ceremony scheduled for June 6th, 2019 at 6:00 PM at Lancaster High School's Lou Bozigian Athletic Field. It is our desire that the graduation ceremony be memorable for everyone.

To help us with this, we ask that you follow these guidelines:

- 1. Please **DO NOT** bring air horns or other noise-makers. These disturb those sitting near you and can be very distracting to other guests at the ceremony.
- 2. Please refrain from bringing silly string, confetti, balloons, posters, etc. into the stands. (Out of courtesy for other guests, please be aware that large balloons obstruct the viewing pleasure of other guests.)
- 3. Do not stand along the front rail. This blocks the view of those sitting behind you and may cause a problem in the case of an emergency evacuation. Security personnel will be assigned to the area to keep the front rail clear.
- 4. The front row of seats on each side of the field is reserved for guests in wheelchairs and with disabilities as required by federal law. Please assist us in reserving these seats for guests with disabilities.
- 5. The saving of seats is not permitted.
- 6. At the close of the ceremony, you will be meeting your graduate in the area in front of the school. Please do not congregate near the gate that the graduates use to exit the field. Remember that guests are not allowed on the field at any time due to safety issues regarding Fire Code restrictions. This year we will have an area set up in the front of the school for you to take pictures of your graduate with their friends.
- 7. Reminder: Diplomas will be picked up by the graduates in the Main Quad on campus after the graduation ceremony, and then will continue to the front of the school to meet family and friends.

Thank you very much for your cooperation and for meeting our expectations of appropriate conduct. We are looking forward to a memorable evening culminating the High School career of the Class of 2019.

Class of 2019 - Graduation Tickets

In an effort to make the Graduation Ceremony as enjoyable as possible for those attending, the following criteria have been established regarding graduation tickets.

- 1. <u>You must have returned your Graduation Agreement in order to get any graduation tickets. Students</u> who turn in their Graduation Contract Late Will Forfeit 1 graduation ticket.
- 2. Each Graduate will be given five (5) tickets for the graduation ceremony at no cost on June 5th after that day's graduation practice. You must have an ID and sign for the tickets when they are given. Count the tickets before you sign for them. Graduate must pick up tickets not parent.
- 3. Extra tickets may be available based on the number of graduates, which varies widely each year, up until the week of graduation. These tickets are based on the total "fire marshal" maximum attendance allowed in the stadium divided by the number of graduates.
- 4. All extra tickets must be signed up for at senior check out day. You may sign up for 1 or 2 tickets to purchase for a cost of \$5.00 each. This will be the only time you will be able to sign up for extra tickets.
- 5. Once all of the tickets have been distributed and sold, no other tickets for graduation will be available per Fire Code / Fire Marshal.
- 6. If you really need extra graduation tickets, please ask other students for extras they may not need.
- 7. Important: If a student gives out a <u>Graduation Invitation</u> through Josten's or some other personal notification, of their Graduation event, <u>that is not a ticket for entry into the stadium</u> during the ceremony.

All guests entering the stadium for graduation must have an admission ticket. Children 2 years or younger may enter without a ticket. Strollers will not be permitted in the stadium.

<u>Those without a ticket will be denied entry.</u> In year's past, several guests have demanded entrance without a ticket. These guests will be denied access and referred to security or on-site law enforcement officers if a disturbance ensues. <u>Fire-code will be enforced for the safety of all guests.</u>

I realize that this may limit the number of guests that will be able to attend the graduation ceremony, but after considering such issues as crowd control and emergency evacuation procedures, the **Fire Marshal has determined these restrictions to be necessary and there are no exceptions.**

SENIOR CHECKOUT INFORMATION

SENIOR CHECK-OUT May 31st

Preparing for senior checkout date:

Please clear all of the following steps before the 2:30 May 30th to be able to successfully complete senior check-out.

- 1. Finish all apex/ senior finals with a passing grade in the class.
- 2. Return all Library and Textbooks.
- 3. Pay all Fines and Fees (accountant)
- 4. Pay all cafeteria fees.

If any of these steps are not done before you walk into the Library for senior check out on May 31st you will not be able to check out and you will not be given your cap and gown for graduation.

Senior Check-Out:

The following will occurring during Senior Check out

- 1. You will be given a senior check out form when you enter the library.
- 2. You will take the form to all stations and get the form signed or stamped by the appropriate staff member.
- 3. You will take the completed form to retrieve your cap and gown.
- 4. If you cannot finish your checkout form for any reason you will be asked to leave the library and will not be able to get your cap and gown. (Please refer above to what needs to be completed before May 30th at 2:30 pm)
- 5. After you have received your cap and gown then you will be able to sign up for 1 or 2 extra graduation tickets. These tickets will only be sold to you if they are available depending on the number of graduates. You may not request more than 2 tickets and you may only request tickets on check out day after successfully completing senior check out.

Graduation Practice Schedule 2019

June 3rd, 4th, and 5th

You must attend all graduation practices in order to be allowed to participate in Graduation. *With only three practices, missing them will not be allowed.

You must be in district dress code at all times while at practices. **EXCEPTION:** Hats other than Lancaster High School hats will be allowed to prevent sunburn.

Monday, June 3rd 8:00 AM to 11:30 Grad Practice Day 1: All students are to report to the Lg. Gym.<u>Must have School ID</u>.

<u>**Tuesday, June 4th 8:00 AM to 11:30 Grad Practice Day 2:**</u> Report to the large gym, simulate the full graduation from the Lg. Gym to the Field and march out to the front of the school. Must have School ID.

Wednesday, June 5th 8:00 AM to 10:30 - Grad Practice Day 3:

Report to the large gym, simulate the full graduation from the Lg. Gym to the Field and march out to the front of the school. Bring sunscreen, water and a hat.Must have School ID.

Seniors are NOT allowed on the main (classroom) campus at any time after May 31st —No exceptions! You will not be allowed to go to a teacher's classroom for any reason during the school day. Seniors found to be on campus interrupting classrooms after Friday, May 31st will be subject to a citation for trespassing and removal from the graduation ceremony scheduled for June 6th If you absolutely must see a teacher or handle some emergency on campus, arrange to resolve the issue via e-mail or after school hours. An administrator is available at the front visitor office if you have school emergency issues.

At the practices, the more attentive you are, the sooner you will be dismissed. We want your graduation to be a memorable one for you, your parents, the staff and the community. Be on time and follow directions.

We want the graduation ceremony for the Class of 2018 to be memorable for all involved. We also want you to have a great time. Please remember that you are expected to behave appropriately. Any disruption to the ceremony will result in immediate removal from the field and that student will be referred to Administration and not allowed to participate in the Graduation Ceremony on Thursday June 6th.

Class of 2019 - Cap and Gown Distribution [May 31st]

Caps and gowns will be distributed from the Large Gymnasium on May 31st, during econ class in the library. You must have your <u>school I.D. with a photo</u> in order to receive your cap and gown. Only you (student w/ ID) will be allowed to pick up your cap and gown.

The procedure for Cap & Gown pick up will be as follows:

- 1. You will be given a senior check out form when you enter the library.
- 2. You will take the form to all stations and get the form signed or stamped by the appropriate staff member.
- 3. Before lining up to get your cap and gown, your school I.D. will be scanned. You will then give your Student Clearance Form to the parent volunteer along with your photo I.D. They will give you your cap and gown and have you sign for it. That's it.

If you owe money to the school for any reason, Ms. Mendoza will be in the library to collect those fees and fines you can pay on the 31st in CASH only. After this day your cap and gown will be in the accounting office. After you pay your bill, she will give you your cap and gown. Be aware that this line tends to get extremely long. To avoid waiting hours in this line, pay all your fees well before May 30th. Your student Clearance Form and photo I.D. will be required. If you purchased a cap and gown and will not participate in graduation, you may pick it up from the Activities Office after June 6th.

It is advisable that you go by Mrs. Mendoza office well before May 30th and check your account. If you have a charge for anything, take care of it now; not at the last minute.

GRAD-BASH 2019 – General Information

ATTENTION ALL GRADUATES! Grad-Bash for the Class of 2019 will be held on May 31st at Universal Studios. Here is some very important information.

- The busses will load at Lancaster High School; <u>3:30 PM for an 4:00 PM departure.</u> Be On TIME!!! Busses will leave promptly – you need to be on the bus to be involved with any Grad-Bash activities. Universal Studios is open to the public until 8PM. Grad-Bash activities continue with students until 2AM.
- 2. Returning from Grad-Bash: The busses will load at <u>2:00 AM</u> for a 2:30 AM departure from Universal Studios. <u>YOU MUST BOARD THE BUS before 2:30 AM</u> If you are not on the bus by that time, this is considered a serious discipline issue and you may be barred from the Graduation Ceremony. Parents have to be notified if students do not show up to board the busses as scheduled.
- 3. Refer to the next page. Universal Studios Senior Grad-Bash Dress Code for your Do's and don'ts. This includes things you can wear and bring.

IMPORTANT NOTICE: Text messaging through Remind.com will be used to communicate with Chaperones at Grad-Bash. <u>All Grad-Bash students are to text the</u> <u>message [@gbLnHS19 to 81010]</u> We will not use the Sr. Class remind text system because many of those seniors are not going to Grad-Bash and won't want to get messages at 2AM to board busses or 4AM to contact their rides to pick them up at the school. If Students need to get in contact with one of their Chaperones as a back up to the cell phone text system, they can go to Chaperone Headquarters where an Event Staff member will assist them and their Chaperone will be called by phone directly.

Lancaster High School: Grad-Bash Dress Code & Prohibited Items (Quick Reference list)

Universal Studios Guidelines and Prohibited Items list have been established to ensure a safe event for all our Guests.

Lancaster H.S. Dress Code Applies at this event. See Complete Prohibited list, Extensive Version on the LnHS website.

- 1. Common Sense prevails: Wear comfortable / appropriate clothing. Check list below.
- 2. Students get cold in Universal City after sunset!!! We highly recommend warm clothes.
- 3. You will be checked for contraband / dress code two times:

1st: Boarding bus from LnHS,2nd: Entering Universal Studios upon arrival

4. Universal Studio's Dress Code and LnHS Dress Code must be followed. NO EXCEPTIONS!!!

Things to remember:

• Failure to follow the Dress Code Guidelines may result in delayed admission and/or denial of admission to Grad –Bash.

• Universal studios Event Staff has the right to refuse admission to anyone they deem inappropriately dressed.

Universal Studios Senior Grad Bash Dress Code

Universal Studios Hollywood's Grad Bash is a once-a-year school event requiring enforcement of a dress code to ensure proper dress/attire for students and chaperones. All outfits must remain intact for the entire Universal Studios Hollywood's Grad Bash event and any Pre or Post Parties. We thank you in advance for your cooperation with our dress code.

ACCEPTABLE ATTIRE: Note Customized "Class of 2019" or "Seniors" T-shirts are acceptable as long as there is no specific school identifiers on them.

PLEASE NOTE: The school is responsible for enforcing the dress code prior to arrival at the event.

UNACCEPTABLE ATTIRE

- Clothing, hats and other head attire affiliated with any high school, sports team, group, club etc.
- Clothing, hats and other head attire or accessories with area codes
- Belts, wallet chains, or jewelry of any kind containing spikes
- Extremely revealing clothing including: bathing suit tops or bottoms
- Sheer Clothing, or see-through clothing of any kind
- Bare midriffs, visible undergarments
- Any clothing deemed inappropriate at a school function
- Guys may not wear tank tops or undershirts
- Clothing or tattoos with language or graphics that are obscene, offensive or suggestive of sexual, vulgar, drug, alcohol, or tobaccorelated messaging
- No matching or like attire amongst students including team shirts of any kind, high school, college, or professional
- No team jerseys of any kind, high school, college or professional
- Girls may not wear tube tops, tube top dresses, one shoulder shirts or any off the shoulder dresses or backless clothing of any kind.

PROHIBITED ITEMS

- Large backpacks, camera bags, tote bags, and oversized purses larger than 8.5" X 5.5"
- Weapons, knives, laser pointers, and chemical irritants of any kind
- Over-the-counter medications; electronic cigarettes, tobacco or tobacco related products such as lighters, matches, pipes, etc.; and alcohol or any controlled substance
- Any containers with fluids of any kind; this includes water, any drinks and perfumes
- Permanent markers/etching tools
- Aerosol cans/bottles of any type
- Items manufactured to resemble or be used as weapons, i.e.: switchblade combs, cat eye key fobs.

PLEASE NOTE: Some schools may enforce a stricter dress code.

Universal Studios Hollywood Team Members and Event Staff have the right to refuse admission to anyone whom they deem to be dressed inappropriately for the event and not in compliance with these guidelines, and will continue to enforce this dress code throughout the event.

Code of Conduct

Welcome to Universal Studios Hollywood and Universal CityWalk ("Universal"). In order to ensure that your visit and that of your fellow guests is pleasant, we request that all visitors to Universal comply with the following Code of Conduct:

- 1. Do not physically or verbally threaten or harass any person. Fighting, use of physical force, obscene or sexually explicit language or gestures, or racial, religious or ethnic slurs, including any display on apparel or via body art likely to create a disturbance or a danger to other persons, are prohibited.
- 2. Do not possess any item that could be used as a weapon, including, but not limited to: firearms, explosives, fireworks, clubs or sticks over 1/4 inch in diameter, chemical dispensing devices, knives with blades over 2 inches in length, or any other object(s) that may be used in any way to inflict bodily injury on another person.
- 3. Do not yell, scream, sing, play musical instruments, radios, audio players or other sound amplification devices, or otherwise communicate in a manner which creates noise of sufficient volume to disturb the ambient noise level of Universal or impinge on the hearing or peace of other persons beyond a ten (10) foot radius.
- 4. Visitors must be fully clothed, including shoes and shirts. Visitors may not wear any covering that fully or partially obscures their face unless for religious or medical reasons. Clothing that Universal construes as indecent, exposes excessive portions of the skin, or that Universal views as inappropriate for a family environment is prohibited.
- 5. Do not run, skate, rollerblade, skateboard, ride a bicycle or scooter, or use wheeled shoes. Do not obstruct or interfere with the free flow of pedestrian traffic.
- 6. Do not discard litter of any kind except in designated trash receptacles. Rummaging through or removing items from the trash receptacles or coin fountains are prohibited. Spitting is prohibited. Urinating anywhere except at designated restrooms is prohibited.
- 7. Do not deface, damage or destroy any property belonging to Universal, its merchants or other persons.
- 8. Use or possession of any illegal substances or paraphernalia is prohibited. Smoking is not permitted during event.
- 9. No photographing or videotaping for commercial purposes without Universal's prior consent. No photographing or videotaping in a manner that is harassing or disruptive to Universal's merchants or other persons.
- 10. Do not solicit money or other contributions or donations, or sell admission tickets to CityWalk and/or Universal Studios Hollywood or Gibson Amphitheatre, or distribute commercial advertising or promotional material of any kind, or offer samples of items which are sold or available for sale.
- 11. Do not sit on handrails, stairs, escalators, trash receptacles or other areas not specifically designed for sitting. No occupied wheelchairs are allowed on escalators.
- 12. Do not bring any animals on to Universal's property with the exception of service animals providing assistance to disabled persons and/or in the company of persons claiming to be a trainer of a service animal.
- 13. Daytime curfews (Los Angeles Municipal Code 45.04) and nighttime curfews (Los Angeles Municipal Code 45.03, unless accompanied by an adult after 10:00 p.m.) will be enforced.
- 14. Line jumping where the use of a queuing system is employed is prohibited.
- 15. Coolers, food purchased off of the property, any container or vessel containing food or any container of beverages is not permitted in the park. Exceptions may be made in advance for medical, special dietary or religious reasons only (see medical form).
- 16. All bags, backpacks and purses are subject to inspection by Universal security without advance notice and should not be left unattended.
- 17. Do not violate any federal, state or local law or ordinance. Failure to comply with all posted rules, signs, warnings and policies is prohibited.

Violators of this Code of Conduct will be asked to leave the Universal's property and may be cited for trespass or violation of local, state or federal law and/or may be arrested by local law enforcement agencies.

(**Reference: Education Code sections 48900 and 48915**).

I/We agree to the following: (Initial next to all statements)

I will attend mandatory graduation practices on June 3rd, 4th, 5th, 2019.

I will adhere to Lancaster high school rules of behavior and conduct, including district dress code during graduation practices. Failure to do so may result in removal from remaining practices. If I am removed from a practice, I understand that I will not be allowed to participate in the graduation ceremony.

I will wear a cap and gown that has not been altered, modified, or decorated in any way. I will wear attire appropriate for semi- formal occasions underneath the gown.

I will conduct myself in a courteous manner, without distraction or disruption. Failure to do so may result in removal from the ceremony, while in progress. If removed from the ceremony, a meeting with the Principal must be scheduled in order to receive my diploma.

Objects that distract from the ceremony are prohibited. This includes: silly string, noise-makers such as horns, beach balls, and similar items. (These items are a disruption to other graduates and guests – please be courteous to others during this significant family event.)

I promise to explain to all guests invited that they must have a graduation ticket or they will not be allowed access to the stadium due to fire-code regulations. No-one can be admitted without a ticket per the Fire-marshal for the safety of all guests and graduates. Josten's or personal graduation invitations can not be used for admission to the Graduation Ceremony.

Note: Parents, please do not bring noisemakers or items that obstruct the view of others such as balloons, posters, large flower bouquets, etc. Possession of such items may result in non-admittance to the ceremony.
