

SENIOR ACTIVITIES

YOU DRINK & DRIVE. YOU LOSE. THE SOBERING FACTS ABOUT IMPAIRED DRIVING

Chances are you, a friend or a family member have been involved in an alcohol-related motor vehicle crash, resulting in personal injury or property damage. In fact, recent studies have shown that three in ten people will become involved in an alcohol-related crash in their lifetimes.

Last year alone, 10,874 traffic fatalities were attributed to impaired driving. Remarkably, these numbers represent a 38.4 percent decrease from previous years. While these results are encouraging, the fact remains that too many lives are lost each year to a tragedy that can be avoided. That's why the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) has initiated the **You Drink & Drive. You Lose.** campaign, with the goal of reducing the current fatality rate to no more than 11,000 per year by the year 2020. Through this effort, NHTSA hopes to educate the public about the dangers associated with impaired driving, creating not only a change in attitude, but a change in behavior.

What constitutes impairment?

Impairment begins with one alcoholic drink – whether it be "hard" liquor, wine or beer. Once alcohol is consumed, it is absorbed by an individual's blood system, and can be measured as Blood Alcohol Concentration (BAC). Studies show that even one drink decreases one's ability to react quickly, a factor that can prove fatal when an impaired individual gets behind the wheel of an automobile.

How do I know when I'm past my limit?

While accepted BAC levels vary from state to state, the rate of absorption in one's body varies according to an individual's height, weight, experience with alcohol and food consumed prior to alcohol consumption. So it is a good idea to assign a designated driver and/or plan alternate modes of transportation when even a minimal amount of alcohol is consumed in any given situation.

What will happen to me if I get caught?

If an individual is found to be impaired while driving, he/she will experience criminal repercussions. These repercussions can include fines, the loss of driving privileges, incarceration, higher insurance rates and a criminal record. Law enforcement officers are cracking down on impaired drivers, stepping up their policing activities on a regular basis, and implementing a network of sobriety checkpoints and saturation patrols throughout the year.

The question of being caught, however, is a major factor in the impaired driving problem. The public needs, instead, to ask, what will happen if I don't get caught? This answer is much more frightening, and carries with it much more dire consequences than fines, prosecution or the loss of one's license. The destruction impaired drivers inflict upon their communities is immeasurable. Everyone is affected by the impaired driver's irresponsible and malicious behavior, whether it be from higher taxes or the emotional destruction a family experiences after losing a loved one. Because no matter how you look at it, when **You Drink & Drive, You Lose**.

All Students must submit an application and have a 2.0 on the 1st Sem. report card. Positive Discipline & Attendances is required. Student Applications will be available online on Feb. 3rd. Guest Applications will be available on the bulletin board across from the Activities Office and must be turned in by Feb. 19th for Rush Day. This is a formal dinner-dance. Girls are to wear formal or party dresses. No bare midriffs or dresses that are low-cut in the front or back. Hemlines need to be at knee length or longer. Boys are to wear suits, dinner jackets or a tux. Zoot suits, chains and walking canes will not be allowed. Regular sale tickets will be sold at snack, lunch or after school only.

All students MUST <u>show</u> their school I.D. and be at least high school level. Only guests under the age of 21 will be permitted to attend on an approved guest pass. CAPS AND GOWNS

Caps and gowns will be issued in the Library on May 29, 2020 with your Social Studies Class *Please press the gown to remove wrinkles.* Put your cap on well forward with the short point almost between your eyebrow. Wear your tassel over your <u>RIGHT</u> eye.

Please do not throw your caps in the air after graduation. There are many important reasons:

You most likely will not find your cap again, and most students like to keep their personal cap as an important keepsake. Even if you could locate your personal cap, it will likely end up in the dirt and walked on before you retrieve it.

ACCESSORIES

Everyone should bring several bobby pins and a couple of safety pins for emergencies. It may be very windy, and you will need to secure your hats with bobby pins. If something breaks on your gown, you may need your safety pins. Do not chase your hat or anything else that may blow away. We will have Junior Class Ushers pick up items that are retrievable for you when possible.

Most importantly, what goes up must come down. More than one student has lost an eye from the sharp corner of a cap hitting them. Please don't take a chance on ruining a friend's graduation, their eye, or even your own from an avoidable disaster.

The graduation gown is also yours to keep. Take care of it. Many graduates keep both their cap and gown as important keepsakes.

SENIOR ACTIVITIES

- Graduates are to be courteous during the entire ceremony and are to refrain from any activity which is disruptive, distracting or dangerous. Please follow directions.
- Graduates are not to carry anything with them into the ceremony. Caps and gowns shall not be altered or decorated in any fashion. Purses and other personal items are to be left with family members and guests.
- 3. Any student who appears to have been drinking prior to the ceremony or appears to be under the influence of any controlled substance will not be allowed to participate. Graduates are prohibited from drinking or smoking during the ceremony.
- 4. Graduates will dress appropriately for a ceremony of this nature. Examples of inappropriate dress are beach and sports clothing, thong-type sandals, jeans, t-shirts, etc. Dress code policy will be enforced. If a candidate for graduation violates any of the above behavior standards, that student will NOT receive a diploma at Graduation and will be asked to leave the ceremony. The student will be required to attend a parent conference with the principal the week following graduation.

GRADES
